THE PASTOR PONDERERS

Fill the Stable

I recently received an email from Peggy Lynch, one of the MISSION board members who works with the self-governing homeless tent community, *Camp Take Notice* (CTN), in Ann Arbor. She writes that CTN has had a continual, steady influx of people "including three pregnant women in the last few weeks." This is because "Delonis cannot house all of the homeless who need shelter" and is "referring them nearly daily" to CTN. "They nearly always arrive with nothing -- no sleeping bag, blankets, tent or flashlight, except bus tokens Delonis gave them and perhaps winter clothes from Delonis." So the needs are immense, and CTN is having difficulty even meeting its modest goal of providing "a tent, sleeping bag and/or blankets to everyone who comes." Then she goes on to tell this story:

Last week, I went to camp late one night to pick up blankets to launder them, because camp was totally out of blankets. When I arrived, a new 23-year-old camper who'd been sent by Delonis was trying to sleep in a community tent but had no blankets. I pulled two tablecloths off of the dinner tables to put on him, together with a large woman's coat and a scarf, to keep him warm on that 30-degree night. As I was leaving with the laundry, two more campers came up to beg for the wet, nasty blankets I was trying to take to launder. While they were speaking, an established camper on the Executive Committee came up and offered to let them stay in his tent and share his blankets for the night so I could launder the nasty ones. It was heartbreaking to not even have used blankets to give folks who had nowhere else to go.

It was just amazing to watch yet again a homeless camper, who probably owns nothing but a tent and blankets, share it with newcomers. Camp resources are super stretched, but I'm confident these basic humanitarian needs will somehow be met.

Of course I can't help thinking of Mary and Joseph--pregnant, poor, and functionally if not literally homeless in Bethlehem—looking for a warm, safe place to give birth to Jesus, and having to make do with an innkeeper's stable. Where would they be sent if they came to Ann Arbor in that state in 2011? Like the "three pregnant women" who have come to CTN in recent weeks, would they receive even the minimal shelter of a tent and blankets?

Friends, I cannot ignore this need. I realize that we are a congregation of great generosity which is already being exercised, especially in this season of SASS Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets, special gift offerings to Heifer, congregational pledging, etc. I don't want to detract from those wonderful ministries, or add to anyone's sense of burden. But I do invite those of you who are so moved to join me in a little Christmas giving project I'm calling "Fill the Stable." Here's how it works:

Below is a list of items the camp particularly needs. Holy Faith will be taking up a collection on the "stage" area at the front of the Fellowship Hall. This area is our Advent "stable" to be filled with clean, used or new items. Got unneeded sleeping bags or coats or tarps in your basement or attic? Bring them in. Want to spend a little for CTN at a local thrift shop or camping supply store? By all means! Let's see how full we can make our stable. I, and anyone who wants to help me, can deliver the items to the camp on December 18.

Why? Because the "reason for the season" is one who was born poor, with nothing, in a stable, for us.

1. Clean sleeping bags, quilts, blankets and the camping pads that are used under sleeping bags
2. Winter coats (especially large men's sizes), hats, boots, mittens, gloves, scarves
3. Tarps, tents, and 1-pound cannisters of propane
4. Money, of course, is always needed, as are AATA bus tokens. Checks can be made out to MISSION.

Items that must be provided for each basket are:

- turkey or ham or gift card to cover meat cost at a Saline grocery store (please be sure the dollar amount of the gift card is clearly indicated)
- potatoes (raw or boxed)
- fresh salad ingredients and dressing
- fresh vegetables
- oranges or apples
- stuffing mix
- gravy (in jar or can)
- rolls or biscuits
- margarine or butter
- milk or juice
- dessert (ready-to-eat; boxed cake mix and frosting, etc.)

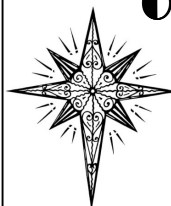


Special Gifts Offering Dec. 2011 Heifer International

Heifer also uses our funds to train and educate families to use and care for their animals, to use sustainable farming methods, and to find access to veterinary care and markets for their products. Finally, because each recipient family must pass on the first offspring of the animal they received, or the equivalent, each gift is multiplied again and again with each new generation.

They have recommended that she move on to the next stage of the ordination process, and the PLT has affirmed their recommendation. Congratulations, Marcia! Special Gifts Offering Jan 2012 Saline Area Social Services

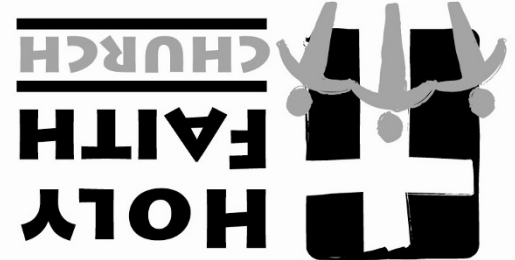
